School Board Proceedings Dell Rapids School District 49-3 July 9, 2012

The Dell Rapids School District Board of Education met Monday, July 9, 2012 at 7:00 p.m. in the high school distance learning room with the following members present: Brian Davis, Tom Morris, Troy Randall, Cindy Schuch, and Matt Weiland. Incoming board member present: Steve Stofferahn. Absent: None.

President Davis called the budget hearing to order at 7:00 p.m. and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

The board reviewed the proposed budget for FY2013 and the five-year Capital Outlay Plan. Morris stated that a generous donation of \$15,500 from the Elite Club would make it possible to reinstate the assistant activities director and coaching positions that were cut in FY2012. The budget committee's recommendation was to add these positions. Addition of a middle school aide was not recommended by the budget committee. Business Manager Littel reported that the audit cost proposal and the addition of special education director duties to the elementary principal's contract would require budget increases.
