

indergarten Registration is a unique experience. A team of educators will provide prekindergarten screening

activities to help parents assess their child's readiness for kindergarten. Kindergarten teachers, speech clinicians, and a school nurse will be present to assist parents. Kindergarten Registration is scheduled for April 23 and 24 at the United Methodist Church (505 E 5th St., Dell Rapids). If your child will be

5 on or before September 1, 2009, you must contact Dell Rapids Elementary School to register your child for the next school year at 428-3192. It is important to notify the school before March 27, 2009 to insure that there are proper student/teacher ratios and enough materials for your child.

As parents/guardians, you can plan for this registration by making sure all of your child's immunization records are up-to-date with your family doctor and providing the school with a copy of the state immunization certificate, including kindergarten shots. You will also need to bring a **certified** copy of your child's birth certificate and social security number. Once the school has the names of all the students planning to attend kindergarten in the 09/10 school year, you will be notified by mail as to a specific appointment time for your child's screening.





WHAT'S Cafeteria?

White vs. Wheat Bread:

Most kids, even those who are picky eaters, like bread, and that's good, because bread and grains make up a big part of the Food Guide Pyramid.

But what kind of bread should you



offer your child? There are so many choices, including white bread, wheat bread, honey wheat bread, etc.

Whether it is white bread or wheat bread, find one that is high in calcium (at least 10-15%

per slice), high in fiber (at least 1-1.5g per slice), and which tastes good.

The American Academy of Pediatrics does state that 'whole-wheat bread offers a nutritional advantage over white bread.' So if your child likes it, a 100% whole wheat bread that is fortified with calcium would likely be the healthiest choice.

Spring is Here!

Spring is here and kids are spending more time outdoors. Let's make sure they are eating healthy snacks. Here are a few healthy snack ideas for kids.

- Peal a banana and dip it in yogurt. Roll in crushed cereal and freeze.
- 2. Mix together ready-to-eat cereal, dried fruit and nuts in a sandwich bag for an on-the-go snack.







The Ballot Question

The Dell Rapids School Board is asking voters to consider a \$13.5-million bond election for the construction of a new elementary school.

Investment in Our Community

The Dell Rapids community has grown more than 8 percent since the 2000 census. The Dell Rapids student population has increased nearly 20 percent in the past ten years. Our current elementary building is outdated: it was built in 1957; the gym and north entryway added in 1961; Kindergarten and 1st grade classrooms added in 1982; the library, music, art and offices added in 1988; and two unattached temporary buildings were added in 1997. We have more students than the facility can handle. Individual classrooms are too small for the number of students in each class, and the facility is not designed to meet the demands of modern academic standards and teaching methods.

Voter Registration

Residents not registered by <u>April 13, 2009</u> will not be able to vote in this election. If you are in doubt about whether you are registered in the Dell Rapids School District, call the Minnehaha County Auditor at (605) 367-4220 or the Moody County Auditor at (605) 997-3161. If you are interested in voting, and are NOT registered, registration may be completed during regular business hours at the county auditor's office, municipal finance office, secretary of state's office, and those locations which provide driver's licenses, food stamps, TANF, WIC, military recruitment, and assistance to the disabled as provided by the Department of Human Services. You may contact the county auditor to request mail-in registration forms or access a mail-in form at www.sdsos.gov. Mail-in registrations must be received by the county auditor no later than April 13, 2009 in order to vote in this election.

Absentee Voting

Residents who are registered to vote in the Dell Rapids School District may vote prior to election day by casting an absentee ballot with the school business manager. AGIN ACTION

he Ag III/IV students are finishing up the unit on Wildlife and Fish. Following the wildlife and fish unit, dairy food processing will be the next topic to be covered. This unit will focus on the history of the industry, quality milk production, fluid milk, milk evaluation, concentrated milk, butter, fermented milk and yogurt, cheese, ice cream, nutrition and marketing. A short unit on Ag Machinery covering selection, cost and maintenance will follow the dairy unit.

The classroom instruction part of the Small Engine class that started 4th quarter continues. The topics of fuel and emission control systems, carburetion, ignition systems, lubrication systems, cooling systems and preventative maintenance and troubleshooting are still to be covered. Once those topics are covered, the students will have the opportunity to bring engines into the shop and work on them. Those projects can range from simple maintenance to complete overhaul.

Individual shop projects are the focus of the Ag II students. They are applying their skills learned in previous classes to construct wood or metal projects designed and paid for by the students. Genetics will be the next unit and will be comprised of livestock reproduction and how traits are passed from parents to the offspring. Following genetics, the students will be exposed to the various methods used to sell agricultural products.

Dan Dorn from the Dells Veterinary Service attended the FFA meeting on March 9th and presented the chapter with a check for \$500. This donation was made possible by a Pfizer Animal Health program. For eligible purchases of Pfizer Animal Health cattle vaccines, a donation of 3 percent was made on behalf of Dells Vet. Services to the FFA Chapter. The chapter will use the money to pay for registration to the various career development events this spring and also to cover the cost of registration to the state convention. The FFA members continue to prepare for the various Career Development Events at the State FFA Convention on April 19-21 held on the campus of SDSU in Brookings. 
