Recently, two students at Dell Rapids High School were chosen to participate in a once in a lifetime experience. Soon to be juniors Lexi Snyder and Ben Hinricher were selected to attend the South Dakota Space Grant Consortium Honors Program.

Dell Rapids Science teacher Jeanne Ludens referred both students to the program after receiving an email with information regarding the agenda. "I thought it would be a great experience for both of them because they both seem to be very interested in science," said Ludens. Attending this camp is a huge honor for both students since only nine boys and nine girls were selected to attend throughout the state.

Ludens said "I think it's very outstanding that a boy and a girl from our school were chosen to attend. I'm very excited to hear about their experience." In order to be selected

to attend this program, students must be juniors or seniors in high school in the fall of 2012, be a South Dakota resident and be a U.S. citizen.

Students will learn about space, earth science, engineering, physics and mathmatics while keeping a college-like schedule. In order to achieve these purposes, a 51st state is made up at the event consisting of many cities and counties, and is used to give the Boys State attendants actual experience in operation and control of government duties. This aids the boys' perception of the problems involved with the government as well as how it functions.

Once reaching Boys State, the boys or "citizens" are assigned to belong to one of the mythical political parties and to live in a specific city and county. They then hold city elections, party assemblies, conventions and more. Officers are also elected at the county and state level. In order to be considered for Boys State, the boys must meet four main requirements. Of course they must also have successfully completed by the end of their current school year, their junior year in high school. Besides that, they should possess definite

leadership qualities that are visible in their school and community involvement. In addition, having a high scholastic rating is an important aspect of Boys State. The boys must also possess outstanding character, honesty and cooperation. Lastly, the boys have to have completed and signed a Statement of Interest.

"I feel very honored to be among the few that were selected to attend Boys State. I think it will be a total life-changing experience. When I come back from Boys State, I hope to share the knowledge with my classmates so they can learn of our government system and become a proud American," said Peter.
