Welcome Back! School officially starts on Monday, August 20, 2012.

Class of 2013 Information

Graduation Date-Commencement is scheduled for Saturday May 11, 2013, at 2:00 P.M.

Senior Pictures - Seniors may have their senior photographs taken by whomever they choose. However, it is important to schedule the photos as soon as possible if this has not already been done. We do not encourage students to miss school to have their senior pictures taken, so it is a good idea to have them taken during vacation days.

Senior Composites - Photos for the senior composite will be taken at school on August 28, 2012 by Photography By Mark. If a student wishes to submit another head and shoulder shot from senior pictures this must be approved by the office and submitted at school by December 14, 2012.

Caps and Gowns - Caps and gowns are ordered shortly after the Christmas holiday break. Payment for the cap and gown is made at the time they are ordered. Generally this costs about \$50.00. Extra tassels in school colors may be purchased at the time the caps and gowns are ordered for a few additional dollars.

Announcements - Graduation announcements are ordered through Jostens after the beginning of the second semester. Josten's meets with the students at school to discuss a design. It is the student's responsibility to order their own announcements; Jostens is one option, however, student's may order announcements from another agency.

School Attendance - Seniors with signed parent consent forms are granted Senior Privileges during their final year. This means seniors are allowed to leave the high school during a free hour or during lunch. It is important to remember that these privileges may be lost if poor attendance or disruptive behavior becomes an issue. This open free period and lunch are privileges which come only when other responsibilities are met.

Building Security

As a follow up to building security, we will continue to lock all doors to the elementary, middle school and high school buildings between the hours of 8:30 a.m. - 3:30 p.m. The exception will be the north door at the elementary and the south door at the MS/HS which will be open. All visitors entering the building must go directly to the office and check in. If you are not a student or a current employee, you are a visitor. In the event of a fire, all exterior doors have panic bars and will open from the inside.

MEETINGS

The Board of Education meetings are held on the second Monday of every month, and fourth Monday of every month, except December. BOE meetings begin at 7 p.m. and are held in the Distance Learning Room at the High School. Agendas can be obtained from the Superintendent's office on the Friday before any meeting. The Dell Rapids Tribune publishes the minutes of each regular and special meeting. Agendas and minutes are also posted on the school website.

Insurance Notes:

The school does not carry insurance to pay for school related accidents. If an accident occurs, all costs from the accident are the responsibility of the person having the accident. Individuals are encouraged to carry accident insurance. Student accident insurance is available through Student Assurance Services, Inc. of Stillwater, MN. The school district had brochures available at registration and will continue to have them available in the school offices. To be eligible for coverage, the envelopes must be returned to the school. Claim forms will be available from the principal throughout the year with coverage subject to the terms of the plans listed on the brochures. The school district does not attempt to become an agent for the company and further questions may be directed to insurance agent David Desch at 1-800-328-2739.

SCHOOL DISTRICT WELLNESS POLICY

In accordance with federal requirements, the Dell Rapids School District has adopted a Wellness Policy and Regulations that support student achievement and the development of lifelong wellness practices through the promotion of healthy eating and physical activity. The policy includes nutrition, physical activity, nutrition education, and other school-based activity components. A committee of school board members, school administrators, food service and health professionals, teachers, parents, and students meets annually to review the policy and recommend changes to the school board. The goal of the physical activity component is to provide opportunities for students to develop physical activity skills, maintain physical fitness, and understand the benefits of a physically active and healthful lifestyle. Physical activity will not be used as punishment, and use of physical activity time for make-up work and testing will be limited. Nutrition standards require that federal requirements are followed in the school lunch and breakfast program. Teachers and parents are encouraged to include healthful food choices for snacks, parties, and celebrations, and the use of food is discouraged as a classroom incentive. No soda will be sold in school vending machines and in the high school, vending machines will offer only foods and beverages on the District's preferred list of healthy foods.

SCHOOL LUNCH:

The Dell Rapids School District participates in the National School Lunch and Breakfast Programs. Lunchtime Solutions provides complete, well balanced, Type A meals that are attractive and satisfying to students. All students are encouraged to enjoy the nutritious meals that include an all-you-can-eat salad bar. Applications for free and reduced price meals are mailed to each family with registration or open-house information and are also available in the principals' offices.

Parents that wish to apply for free or reduced price meals for their children should return their application form to the business office. Students may buy breakfast for \$1.30 at each school. The daily price for lunch at the elementary school is \$2.30, and the daily price for lunch at the middle school and high school is \$2.40. The price for an Adult Meal is \$2.90. The price for an extra milk, or milk for elementary breaks, is \$.45. An Extra Entrée is \$1.55 and an extra pizza slice is \$1.75.

A selection of a la carte items are available for purchase in the middle school and high school after the purchase of a complete meal. Parents are able to place restrictions on student purchases of a la carte items. Accounts may be restricted to allow no purchasing of a la carte items, to place a dollar limit on daily a la carte charges, or to allow a la carte purchases with cash only. To request account restrictions for the 2012-2013 school year, parents should call the business manager or food service director at 428-5473.

The district uses NutriKids computer software for record keeping. Each student has his/her own lunch account, and the district requires payment in advance for students to purchase meals or a la carte items. Any dollar amount can be deposited toward future purchases. It is recommended that deposits into students' accounts be made by check. Meals may also be purchased with cash at the point of service. Through the MyNutriKids.com website, parents are able to use a convenient, easy and secure online prepayment service to deposit money into their child's school meal account. This service also provides parents the ability to view their child's account balance and print out a copy of their child's eating history report for the past thirty days. USE OF SCHOOL FACILITIES

Recognizing that the school facilities belong to the people, the Board of Education desires to cooperate with agencies and organizations within the school district by making school facilities available for their use.

For this reason, all rental and service charges have been kept as low as possible considering the operation and maintenance cost.

If you are interested in using a school facility, please contact the principal of that building. If you are interested in using a school gym please contact Jeff Dvorak, A. D.

ASBESTOS WARNING

In October 1987, the U.S. Congress passed the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act. Asbestos is a fiber, which in the past had been used in building construction materials, and has been identified as being a disease-causing agent, including a cause of cancer. The purpose of the legislation was to insure that school students are provided with a safe environment in which to learn.

Asbestos abatement (removal) has been completed throughout the district. The only asbestos-containing materials that remain in the district are the asbestos vinyl floor tiles located throughout the district's buildings (except the middle school and the new elementary). The district's asbestos staff or contractors will deal with the floor tile as the need arises.

Should any parent/patron have questions regarding the federal law or its application to our district, those persons are invited to direct their inquiries to Summer Schultz, Superintendent.

Parent Notification of "No Child Left Behind"

The federal education law known as "No Child Left Behind" was put in place by President Bush. The law requires that all parents in a Title I school be notified and given the opportunity to request information about the professional qualifications of classroom teachers instructing their child. The Dell Rapids School District provides Title I services to students in the elementary school. If you are interested in obtaining the information concerning the professional qualifications of the classroom teachers instructing your child, you may send your written request to the building principal. The building principal will provide a response.

Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA)

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), a federal law, requires that the Dell Rapids School District, with certain exceptions, obtain written consent prior to the disclosure of personally identifiable information from your child's education records. However, the Dell Rapids School District may disclose appropriately designated "directory information" without written consent, unless you have advised the District to the contrary in accordance with District procedures. The primary purpose of directory information is to allow the Dell Rapids School District to include this type of information from your child's education records in certain school publications. Examples include:

- A playbill, showing your student's role in a drama production;
- The annual yearbook;
- Honor roll or other recognition lists;
- Graduation programs;
- Sports activity sheets, such as for wrestling, showing weight and height of team members.

Directory information, which is information that is generally not considered harmful or an invasion of privacy if released, can also be disclosed to outside organizations without a parent's prior written consent. Outside organizations include, but are not limited to, companies that manufacture class rings or publish

yearbooks. In addition, two federal laws require local education agencies (LEAs) receiving assistance under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA) to provide military recruiters, upon request, with three directory information categories – names, addresses and telephone listings – unless parents have advised the LEA that they do not want their student's information disclosed without their prior written consent.

If you do not want the Dell Rapids School District to disclose directory information from your child's education records without your prior written consent, you must notify the building principal in writing by September 1st of each year. The Dell Rapids School District has designated the following information as directory information:

- *Student's Name
- *Address
- *Telephone listing
- *Date and place of Birth
- *Grade Level
- *Electronic Mail address
- *Dates of Attendance
- *Participation in officially recognized activities and sports
- *Weight & height of members of athletic teams
- *Degrees, honors, and awards received
- *The most recent educational agency or institution attended
- *Photograph

Ag in Action

As the summer break draws to a close and students are getting ready to return to classes, the classes being offered in Agriculture Education for fall semester are: Introduction to Agriculture, Food and Natural Resource class where the students will have the opportunity to learn about the role of the FFA organization in Agriculture Education, define and discuss the concepts of natural resources, demonstrate an understanding of animal science systems, demonstrate an understanding of plant structure and function, relate basic food science technology principles to production agriculture, summarize basic food science technology, and summarize basic principles involved in agricultural systems technology. Those students will also have the opportunity to learn about shop tools and shop safety, project design and construct a small wood project. There will be two sections of the Fundamental Animal Science class.

Those students will have the opportunity to apply knowledge of anatomy and physiology to produce and/or manage animals in a domesticated or natural environment. Students will also recognize animal behavior to facilitate working with animal safety, how to provide proper nutrition to maintain animal performance, know the factors that influence an animal's reproductive cycle and identify environmental factors that affect an animal's performance. In the second quarter students enrolled in the Introduction to Ag Mechanics class will have the opportunity to: apply safety skills with engineering applications with mechanical equipment, structures, land treatment, power utilization and technology; exercise basic skills in blueprint and design development to create sketches, drawing and plans with estimating costs; develop skills required to use construction/fabrication equipment and tools; use a variety of concrete and masonry products; apply math and science principles to identify soil and water engineering and their properties; and apply metal applications. Trevor Peter and Gina Wolles went on the FFA Reward Trip June 9 and 10. Members

earn points by participating in various events throughout the year. Once members have earned enough points, they are eligible to go on the trip. The trip details are then determined by those members. Those five members went to the Mall of America on June 9 and a Minnesota Twins game on June 10. Erica Jurgensen had qualified for the trip, but was unable to attend. The Sioux Empire Fair on August 4 -12 in Sioux Falls has a special FFA division allowing members to exhibit their livestock and compete against other FFA members. The South Dakota State Fair held August 30 – Sept. 3 in Huron also has a special FFA division not only allowing members to exhibit livestock, but they can also enter agriculture mechanics exhibits, agri-science exhibits, horticulture exhibits and chapter exhibits. Any student enrolled in an agriculture class can join the FFA organization which can help prepare students for premier leadership, personal growth and career success. If you would like more information about FFA, contact Mr. Wolff. The first FFA chapter meeting will be held on Monday, August 27th at 7 pm in the high school agriculture classroom.

Snyder brings home the 'Gold' for FCCLA

Dell Rapids High School Sophomore Lexi Snyder attended the 2012 National Family, Career, and Community Leaders of America (FCCLA) Leadership Conference from July 8-12 in Orlando, Florida. She was one of over 7000 guests, along with FCCLA Advisor Bev Rieck, attending this event. Snyder's display board and oral presentation on the Dell Rapids FCCLA Chapter was impressive enough to earn her a high Gold Rating in the Chapter Showcase Display Event.

Family, Career and community Leaders of America is a dynamic and effective national student organization that helps young men and women become leaders and address important personal, family, work, and societal issues through Family and Consumer Sciences education.

"I put pictures and captions and other needed information on a three fold-out poster showing the different community projects and activities our Dell Rapids Chapter has done throughout the year and then gave an oral presentation to the judges using props along with my poster. I received a Gold Award. It was really cool," said Snyder.

Snyder's journey began by qualifying at the state conference in the STAR (Students Taking Action with Recognition) Events competition. These competitive events build proficiency and achievement in leadership and job-related skills. Her display board showed how the DRHS Chapter of FCCLA developed and implemented a well-balanced program of work and promoted FCCLA and Family and Consumer Sciences skills to the community as a whole. Over 3,600 FCCLA students nation wide from the United States, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands participated in these events so it was a great showing for Snyder to come home with the "Gold". Dell Rapids FCCLA Advisor Rieck was a room consultant during the competitive events.

This year's theme for the National Convention was "#realitycheck" and

all the participants discussed several critical issues including family, school and community, violence prevention, physical as well as financial fitness, future career exploration, and countless community service projects. "I listened to some great speakers who helped me to do more for others and told me that we are the future generation," Snyder said.

"I could not have gotten this far without the help and generosity of friends, family, the Lions Club, Dell Rapids Community Fund, and, of course, my advisor Beverly Rieck who encouraged me to always do more and pushed me to do my best. Thank you to everyone who helped, and thank you Ms. Rieck for the countless hours of help and just everything in general," said Snyder.

Policy On Administering Medications At School

- Schools assume great responsibility when administering medications to students. Therefore, parents must strive to give students required medications outside of school hours whenever possible. Many medications can be given outside of school hours by asking your doctor.
- All medications which must be taken at school must be in a container from the pharmacy labeled with the student's name, name of the medication, correct dose, time to be given, and doctor's name (no unlabeled medication will be given). Ask your pharmacist for a second container with the above information on the label for school use. Please pick up this form from the school nurse. No telephone permission will be allowed.
- Only the school nurse and those who have taken a medication administration course will be allowed to give medications. If a liquid medication must be taken at school it must be sent to school on a daily basis with only the amount to be given that day. The container will be returned to the student to take home to be refilled for the next day. A small bottle with the correct labels should be obtained from your pharmacist.
- All students at the middle school/high school will be required to take their own medications. Just the amount needed for the day should be kept by the student. The office may keep a multiple dose bottle and remind the student to take the medication.
- All scheduled II controlled substances such as Ritalin and Dexedrine, must be brought to the school by the parents. Transportation of these medications by the student will not be allowed. Parents must bring in enough medication for one calendar month at the beginning of the month and the empty bottle will be sent home with the student at the end of the month for a refill.

FROM DRES Nurse Notices...

Kindergarten Immunization Records: Up-to-date immunization records for Kindergarten students are required by DRES by the first day of school, Aug. 20; please turn these into the school nurse if you have not already done so.

Food Allergies: DRES has students with significant peanut allergies and is, therefore, continuing its "Peanut Aware" status for the 2012-13 school year. Please do not send peanuts/peanut products to school for lunch or snacks.

DRES is also asking that fish, including tuna, not be sent to school for lunch; we have a student with a severe fish allergy. We would greatly appreciate your assistance in keeping our students safe and healthy!

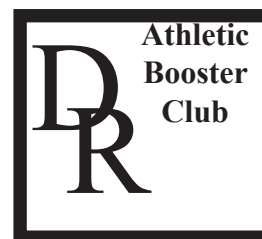

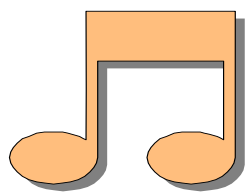
The cost of a high school activity

ticket is \$20.00. The cost of a middle school activity ticket is \$15.00. Any elementary school student may buy the \$15.00 ticket for use during the 2012-2013 school year. Adult 10-punch activity tickets are \$30.00. Adult All-Season Activity Tickets are \$50.00 each.

Activity tickets will be available at the first home football and home volleyball games. Activity admission prices are \$5.00 for adults and \$3.00 for students. Dell Rapids senior citizens (age 62 and over) may pick up a free season pass for most athletic events at the District Office.

Senior Citizen Activity Passes

Senior Citizens (Age 62 & over) who are residents of the Dell Rapids School District can receive free admission to most Dell Rapids Public School athletic events. A card will be required to receive free admission. Free season passes may be picked up at the District office.

Band Instrument Lease

Parents/Guardians (and students age 18 or older) may lease school owned band instruments for student use in accordance with school policy IGDE. The lease fee will be \$75.00 per school year. The lease fee will be waived for students playing a school-owned instrument at the director's request or directive. The lease fee may also be waived by the Superintendent based upon the unique circumstances of the parents/guardians/student.

It is the intent of the Board of Education that no student shall be denied participation in the band program due to inability to afford a musical instrument or to lease a District owned musical instrument. Students (except graduating seniors) may keep the school-owned instrument over the summer for an additional lease fee of \$37.50. Checks should be made payable to the Dell Rapids School District and given to the student's band director.
