A monthly report from the DRPSD Administrative offices on school district happenings, updates, and changes.

The day before Thanksgiving vacation was quite a bit different from the normal day at DRHS... students participated in a Student Health Awareness Day. This day was created in order to educate our students on the importance of establishing a healthy lifestyle and making good choices. Students started their day listening to Mrs. South Dakota International and Miss Teen South Dakota International. These ladies work to raise awareness for and decrease the stigma of mental health issues in children and teens.

Following the morning keynote, students participated in a variety of breakout sessions. During some of these sessions, students learned stress management techniques, discovered strategies for healthy relationships, and practiced self-defense tactics and basic training drills. In all, students benefited from twelve different guest speakers on a variety of physical and emotional health topics.

At the end of the day, students again came together as a student body to hear from Chris Olson, who became a quadriplegic in 2001 as a result of a drunk-driving accident. Chris' message is to look at a common student motto "YOLO - you only live once" in a different way. He encourages students to live each day to the fullest by making wise decisions and making a difference in the lives of others.

Another event which is extremely important to the students at DRHS is the Annual Tour of Homes. This event is the yearly fundraiser for the Junior Class. Each member of the class is asked to sell five tickets and the proceeds from the ticket sales fund the Spring Prom. This year, there are five beautiful homes available for you to tour. More information about the Tour of Homes is contained in the Wise Owl and flyers are displayed in local businesses. If you have yet to purchase a ticket, please call the high school. We appreciate your support and are confident you will have a wonderful time! Even though we do have exciting events such as those I've described above, this winter season can be a time when students may become a bit lethargic and unfocused. Here are just a couple tips for helping your child keep his/her attention focused and energy high... Encourage your child to set weekly goals. Whether it be to score an A on a science test or turn in every English assignment on time, students benefit from setting goals. Working toward specific goals helps them stay focused. Talk with your child about what their goals could be; help them to make their goals specific. It isn't enough to say, "Do well in math class" - making a specific goal ("score at least a 90% on Friday's math test") will help him/her to know the goal has been accomplished and be able to celebrate a job well done. Write the goals down and check them off when they have been achieved. Revisit them during the week and check progress. What is your

Winter is right around the corner. This seems like a good time to create a plan for school-aged children in the event of weather closings or cancellations. Dell Rapids Public Schools understands that our decision to open or close schools has a large effect on our families; however our top priority is the safety of our students. The following information can be used to assist you in preparing your winter weather plan with your children.

How do we make our decision?

School closings are based on careful analysis of many factors including:

- •Information on road conditions from transportation staff and local authorities.
- •Even if your road looks clear, travel somewhere else in the district may be dangerous.
- •We always consider that many of our high school students drive themselves to school.
- •The amount of snow, fog, and ice accumulated by the storm and also the forecast for the remainder of the day.
- •Building conditions such as whether we have proper electricity, heat, and utilities.
- •Facility conditions including lots and sidewalks.
- •Temperature and wind chill. We look seriously at closure when the actual temperatures are in the -25 to -30 range.
- •What decisions other school districts are making plays a part. Please remember that each district is unique in the types of land and terrain that they consider into their decisions. No two districts are exactly alike.

How is the public notified?

DRPS will continue using the School Reach notification system. All registered parents will be notified of changes by email and phone calls. In addition, we will continue to place alerts on local radio and television stations. Please do not call the school district telephones unless it is an emergency. If you need to update your contact information, please contact the Middle School Office at 428-5473 ext.2.

When is the decision made?

Our goal is to have the decision made and on the air by 6 a.m. or earlier. In the event that a cancellation takes place during school hours, we will always try and give a one hour notice to parents before we excuse for the day. Please remember that Haven will be open for two hours after the stated dismissal time.

Although my staff and I do our absolute best with this bad weather process, we know that often no perfect decision exists. If you as a parent feel as it is not safe for your child to attend school, please keep your student(s) home. Contact the school prior to school starting and our building Principals will count your child as excused by parent. You as parents make the final decision on the safety of your child.




Bring a Character to Life



Ag in Action

The five students taking Advanced Ag Mechanics have been working on a variety of projects both for the school as well as personal projects. They removed tack strips from the old elementary to install in the high school in various locations to allow the posting of various information for students to be visible and in a common location without taping it to the walls. This class will end at the conclusion of the first semester.

The Introduction to Agriculture, Food and Natural Resource students have finished the forestry, fish and wildlife unit and will finish out the semester with units on crops and horticulture unit and a short unit on international agriculture and agriculture careers will round out the semester.

The Fundamental Ag Mechanics class has finished up a unit on plumbing. The

students will now go over electronics in agriculture and have an opportunity to go into the shop and look at the various parts of electric motors and go over how to reverse the direction of the motors. The students will finish out the semester going over agriculture buildings which consists of the different types of structures, materials used and environmental concerns.

Courtney Wolles, Karisa Nells, Austin Machmiller and Paige Burggraff demonstrated their leadership skills by competing against over 130 FFA members from 20 different chapters in the Jackrabbit Invitational Leadership event in Brookings on Nov 8. All four members participated in the ag broadcasting and journalism event. The district leadership career development events were held at Hartford on Nov. 13 with Courtney and Karisa competing in the ag broadcasting and journalism event and Austin Machmiller interviewed for one of the seven district

officer positions. Karisa placed 3rd in the district and will be competing at the state event on December 2nd & 3rd in Pierre.

The FFA fruit sale concluded on Nov. 19 with 50 individuals selling items totaling \$20,730. That total is an all-time high and the money raised will fund all of the FFA activities throughout the year. Ashley Welbig was the top selling individual selling \$2,425. The products will be in on Wednesday, Dec. 5, 2012, with the members sorting through the boxes to ensure a quality product before delivering the items they sold starting on Thursday, Dec. 6.

The senior members can apply for their State FFA Degree, with the applications being reviewed on Jan. 30 and they can also apply for FFA scholarships through the State and National FFA, with the application due Feb. 15.


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


