"Don't drink the water" is a saying staff hears often in the elementary hallways this school year. While it seems we generally have 1 or 2 staff pregnancies a school year, this has truly been a unique first semester. Currently, we have 5 staff members who are

expecting with Mrs. Simons welcoming her baby girl on January 22, 2016. It's exciting to see the changes and growth to our families at DRES. As their new adventures of parenting begin, it won't be long before they are asking themselves the question: Is my child ready for Kindergarten? Many parents struggle with this question as they watch their 4 year old develop. It is

a difficult decision that will affect your son or daughter for the next 12 school years and beyond. While sending your child to Kindergarten can be a monumental and frightening step, working closely with the school and looking at the whole child can help parents make the right decision.

South Dakota law stipulates Kindergarten eligibility for those children turning 5 on or before September 1st of the current year. While the chronological



Kindergarten Prep will provide a supportive environment for your child and will focus on social and emotional development, physical and motor development, as well as the academic skills needed to prepare your child for kindergarten. Research suggests that children greatly benefit from programs that address school readiness. The children are nurtured emotionally, socially, and academically to achieve their potential and feel valued as learners. A combination of small group instruction and whole group activities allows the children to develop as cooperative learners. The Kindergarten Prep experience fosters a safe learning environment and fuels the children's natural curiosity and desire to learn.

This meeting was themed Empower Mepower. Members listened to general sessions, ran for office, and participated in STAR Events.

The District Executive Council, consisting of Chairperson/State Officer Kelcie Hauf of Dell Rapids, Co-Chairperson Bailey Meadors of West Central, Secretary Brigette Nelson of Baltic, and Treasurer Evan Marquardt of Canistota presided over the meeting.

Members listened to state leadership team presentations presented by three state team leadership members. Josh Sorbe, the National FCCLA President from Brookings, was the main speaker at the closing session.

STAR (Students Taking Action with Recognition) Events were also held at the meeting. Members competed in Illustrated Talks category. Receiving a gold rating was Beth Bruggeman on the topic dual credit, Taylor Hansen on the topic of hypothyroidism, and Veronica Vanderloo on the topic SIDS. Kailyn Bittner received a silver rating on the topic of deployment. A team of five members competed in the Knowledge Bowl competition.

The event concluded with the announcement of the new 2016-2017 District Executive Council. Beth Bruggeman was installed as the treasurer for the coming year. She and three other officers preside over next year's district meeting.

FCCLA is the only youth-led organization with family as its central focus. Members learn how to be active community leaders, become caring family members, and prepare for life beyond high school.

Youth Attend Healthy Living Summit in Huron

"YOUth Choose Health!" a healthy living youth leadership initiative began its campaign in Huron on October 21, 2015 at the Huron Events center. The South Dakota Youth Foundation sponsored this event in partnership with Avera Health, Regional Health, Great Plains Tribal Chairman's Health Board, Human Service Agency, South Dakota Community Foundation, Sioux Falls Area Community Foundation, USD School of Nursing, SD Discovery Center, South Dakota Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics, and Black Hills Surgical Hospital utilizing the collective impact approach. Professional mentors and 13 statewide healthy living youth council members planned and carried out the event.

School Districts were trained in a holistic approach to leading a healthy lifestyle. One hundred youth and adults participated in collective impact activities that trained and prepared them to lead a collaborative effort in their home communities. They were also given the opportunity to work through various activities and programs found within the community toolkit and participated in hands on activities to create a "connected" atmosphere. Each school team has been provided access to an online healthy living community toolkit that they can use to lead the initiative throughout their school year.

Morgan Kistler, Mikaela Stofferahn, and Taylor Reit, members from the Dell Rapids Public School, and staff member, Beverly Rieck, participated in the event. After attending this session, Mikaela stated, "Teenagers have it hard enough as it is, so learning to lean on each other and help each other is a huge step in the right direction." After attending a session on nutrition and wellness, Taylor said healthy eating is the way to be! The group will be implementing some I am.... and I am not..... statements to post around the school as their first project.

Ag In Action

Because of the high number of students wanting to take Introduction to Agriculture, Food and Natural Resources, another section is being offered the second semester. The 24 second period

students will have the opportunity to learn about the role of the FFA organization in Agriculture Education, define and discuss the concepts of natural resources, demonstrate an understanding of animal science systems, demonstrate an understanding of plant structure and function, relate basic food science technology principles to production agriculture, summarize basic food science technology, and summarize basic principles involved in agricultural systems technology. They will also have the opportunity to learn about shop tools and shop safety, project design and construct a small wood project.

Another section of Wildlife and Fisheries class is being offered during the spring semester to 15 students during 1st half of 3rd block and it will last the entire semester. Students enrolled in this class will recognize the importance of managing fish and wildlife and understand the importance habitat plays in their populations, identify key factors including economic and social issues related to fish and wildlife and identify life patterns of fish and wildlife.

During the 2nd half of 3rd block, 17 students are enrolled in the Ag Business, Sales and Marketing class. In this class students will: examine skills necessary to obtain gainful employment in agribusiness occupations; examine effects of personality on job performance; use principles to accomplish an agribusiness marketing objective; use sales principles to accomplish an agribusiness objective; use computer technology and documents to manage agribusiness inventory; explore opportunities for marketing of agricultural products throughout the world.

The quarter long class of Fundamental Ag Mechanics is being held during 4th block. The students enrolled in this class will have the opportunity to apply safety skills with engineering applications with mechanical equipment, structures, land treatment, power utilization and technology; exercise basic skills in

blueprint and design development to create sketches, drawing and plans with estimate costs; develop skills required to use construction/fabrication equipment and tools; use a variety of concrete and masonry products; apply math and science principles to identify soil and water engineering and their properties.

During the 4th quarter, the class offered 4th block will be Ag Power Technology. This class will consist of 12 students analyzing various engine information in the classroom before going to the shop to work on engines. The classroom instruction will include safety, tools, fasteners, principles of operation, 2 and 4 cycle engines, engine performance, emission controls, carburetion, ignition systems, lubrication systems, cooling systems and preventative maintenance and troubleshooting. The students will then have the opportunity to work on their own engine projects ranging from general maintenance to complete over-hauls.

In the FFA several scholarships are available for senior members such as five scholarship of \$500 each for members who plan to major in agriculture at a South Dakota University or Technical Institute. A \$500 scholarship is available for a member planning to enroll at South Dakota State University majoring in Agriculture Education with these applications due Feb. 15. Younger members can apply for the four \$500 scholarships to attend the Washington Leadership Conference held during the summer with the application deadline also Feb. 15. The National FFA Week will be celebrated from Feb. 20-27. FFA Week is an opportunity for FFA members, alumni and sponsors to advocate for agricultural education and FFA. It's a time to share what FFA is and the impact it has on members every day. In March the Career Development Events take place in preparation for the State FFA Convention. There are 14 different areas that members can develop their skills in that can eventually lead to career success. The areas include: Ag Business Management; Ag Mechanics; Agronomy; Dairy Cattle Evaluation; Floriculture; Food Science; Horse Evaluation; Livestock Evaluation; Meats Evaluation; Milk Quality and Products; Natural Resources; Nursery/Landscape; Range Plant Identification; and Veterinary Science. The competitions will be: March 3 at Howard; March 16 at Flandreau; March 21 at Tri-Valley; March 31 at Lennox; and April 1 at Little International in

Brookings. The State FFA Convention will be held in Brookings on April 10-12, where our members will compete against other members from across South Dakota with the top placing team advancing onto the national event.

We will be holding the FFA Parent/Member Banquet on Sunday, April 17 in the Middle School Commons at 6:30 pm to recognize the members on their achievements from the year.

The summer also has opportunities for members to develop their leadership skills by attending one of the State FFA Leadership Retreats. One retreat will be held June 28-30 at Swan Lake near Viborg and the other will be held July 12-15 at Camp Bob Marshall near Custer. By attending one of these retreats, FFA members will develop and enhance their leadership skills and self-confidence through interactive learning. There will be workshops that help members

discover the value of servant leadership, character, attitude, a focused vision, communication, trust, and responsibility. Another leadership opportunity would be to attend the Washington Leadership Conference. During the five-day event, attendees learn how to become effective leaders by learning purpose, how to value people, how to take action, and how to serve others. FFA members leave WLC with the knowledge and the confidence to act in ways that help their schools, community, and their country.
