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The 'Principle' Corner - A monthy report on school changes and academic updates by Principal Kimberly Kludt

Happy New Year!! I'm sure many of you have already made your new year's resolutions. In the world of education, we have the opportunity to do this twice a year... once at the beginning of the school year and once with the rest of the world in January. At the beginning of this new year, I would like to share with you some goals (new year's resolutions of sorts) I shared with the staff and students this last August.

Dell Rapids High School instructor Tom Wolff shared this information with me after receiving it at a conference. The minute I read them, I knew they were exactly the way I wanted to start the school year, and it is good to renew our focus at this time:

The first goal, or resolution of sorts, was to HAVE A GOOD ATTITUDE. Teachers and students experience difficult situations every day and are set to experience even bigger challenges in the near future. I have already shared with you the changes we are seeing in content standards and state-mandated testing. In addition, we will soon see extensive changes in teacher/principal evaluation and accountability standards (formally known as NCLB). More is being required than ever before, and it is going to be a great challenge. It will become even more important to maintain a good attitude about what we are being asked to teach and learn.

The second school-year resolution was to SET GOALS. As we move into the second semester, it is now again time for teachers and students to set new goals. Students may set academic goals, to do well on a test or in a class. They may set goals outside the classroom, to win a game or finish a community service project. Teachers will set goals as well... to find new and interesting ways to teach and to find new ways to help students who struggle. When we set goals, we are much more likely to achieve them. Even if we fail, we are still better for having tried.

The final resolution was to BE NICE. We recently learned during the anti-bullying presentation that a student standing up for other another student is the most effective way to stop a bully (70% effectiveness rate). It is amazing to me... and empowering at the same time... to think that such a simple act, just being nice to each other, can eliminate one of the most insidious behaviors of our time. If we had no other reason to adopt this resolution, we have one now. As one of the presenters said Monday night, Dec. 19, 2011, it is time to stop dealing with bullying and eliminate it.

As we return to finish the 2011-2012 school year, we will renew our focus on these three resolutions. Together, we have the opportunity and the ability to do great things. I'm looking forward to keeping you updated on what those great things are... stay tuned!

When inclement weather threatens, our goal will be to make early morning decisions about the cancellation or postponement of school by 6:00 AM. Students and parents should check the district's website or listen to the media listed above. Decisions that will be made will follow three categories: No School; School Starting Late (in hours) or Buses will be running snow routes only. If any variation is heard from these announcements the information should be verified by checking the District's website.

Snow routes will only be used when absolutely necessary, and it will be announced **EACH** time they are used. For instance, it should not be assumed that just because snow routes were used in the morning that they will be used in the afternoon. When the decision is made to utilize the snow routes, this decision will apply to **EVERY** bus route regardless of the conditions present on a particular bus route. Weather and road conditions can vary greatly across the district, and it is simply impossible to run some buses on snow routes and others on regular routes. There is too much confusion.

On Monday, Dec. 12, 2011, Brenda Murtha, the Director of Financial Aid for Augustana College, came to Dell Rapids High School to give a PowerPoint presentation about financial aid to the seniors and their parents.

Financial Aid is money from certain places that helps a student with the costs of college. Some financial aid includes shoclarships, grants, loans, and employment opportunities (most financial

sources are to supplement, not replace, resources of the family). In the presentation, the definition of need was shown as a subtraction prolem (Cost of Attendance (COA) minus Expected Family Contribution (EFC) equals financial Need); EFC for dependent students is decided by parent contribution from income and assets and student contribution from available income and assest. There are many sources of financial aid from Federal to State organizations, colleges, universities, churches, private foundations, and many others. Students and parents were made sure of their options and opportunities that will help with the secondary

## Ag In Action

The new semester will have two sections of Wildlife and Fisheries. These classes will be offered during the first and second skinny class periods and they will last the entire semester. Students enrolled in this class will recognize the importance of managing fish and wildlife and understand the importance habitat plays in their populations, identify key factors including economic and social issues related to fish and wildlife and identify life patterns of fish and wildlife.

Because of the high number of students wanting to take Introduction to Agriculture, Food and Natural Resources, another section will be offered the second semester. These students will have the opportunity to learn about the role of the FFA organization in Agriculture Education, define and discuss the concepts of natural resources, demonstrate an understanding of animal science systems, demonstrate an understanding of plant structure and function, relate basic food science technology principles to production agriculture, summarize basic food science technology, and summarize basic principles involved in agricultural systems technology. They will also have the opportunity to learn about shop tools and shop safety, project design and construct a small wood project.

The quarter long class of Ag Metal Fabrication will be held during 4th block. The students enrolled in this class will have the opportunity to: understand the basics of metal fabrication, basic metal skill and designing of plans; understand the principles of oxyacetylene, shielded metal arc, gas metal arc, and tungsten inert gas welding and the correct operation of the equipment; understand the principles of plasma arc cutting and the correct operation of the equipment. The students will be required to perform specific welds for grades and after the required welds are completed, they will design and construct metal projects.

Senior FFA members can apply for the State FFA Degree and their applications will be reviewed on Jan. 25 to make sure they meet the requirements. The district Star Greenhand will also be selected at that time. The senior members are also working on various scholarships available to FFA members. The Corduroy Classic is scheduled to be held Saturday, Feb. 25. This event includes a pre-game reception for FFA members and half-time festivities. It will be a night of great basketball and an opportunity to celebrate the special connection SDSU shares with the FFA. The FFA members are starting to prepare for the spring career development events. Those events areas include: Ag Business Management, Ag Mechanics, Ag Sales, Agronomy, Dairy Cattle Evaluation, Dairy Foods, Floriculture, Food Science, Horse Evaluation, Livestock Evaluation, Meats Evaluation, Natural Resources, Nursery/Landscape and Range Plant Identification. The first event will be the livestock judging contest held during the Sioux Empire Farm Show on Saturday, January 28.

There is also a youth invitational calf show open to FFA members Tuesday, Jan. 24 at the Sioux Empire Farm Show. Members are also busy planning activities for the National FFA Week February 18 – 25.




