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The 'Principle' Corner - A monthly report on school changes and academic updates by Principal Kimberly Kludt

Just as students are winding down their school year, teachers are gearing up to learn, collaborate and professionally grow. This is not an uncommon occurrence; teachers traditionally use summers to gain additional knowledge and skills they then pass along to their students. There are three key topics on which teachers will focus their efforts.

The first focus will be the implementation of the Common Core math and English language arts standards. Teachers will be spending a significant amount of time preparing to teach the Common Core standards. These standards have been formally adopted and will be tested starting in the spring of 2014. Teachers from the elementary, the middle school, and the high school will begin the process of implementing these standards within a learning environment rich in collaboration, communication, creativity, and critical thinking. The goal of this work is two-fold... for teachers to have a complete understanding of what the standards require and for them to create a written, taught, and tested curriculum with complete K-12 alignment. Much of this work will take place within our district with teachers creating a well-defined scope and sequence of skills for students to master.

The second focus will be for science teachers. Just as math and English language arts teachers have received a new set of standards, science teachers will soon be introduced to a newly developed "Framework for K-12 Science Education." This framework includes a focus on science, engineering, and technology. It is developed to ensure students are able to understand and participate in current public policy discussions, to make informed decisions, and to be critical consumers of the scientific information. Most science teachers will begin the process of examining the new standards during the 2012-2013 school year; however, we do have one teacher who has a jump start on the process. Mr. Dugaard, high school physical science, chemistry, and physics instructor at DRHS, is a valued member of the team currently working to develop these "Next Generation" science standards. We appreciate his hard work and look forward to him leading the rest of our science educators as they familiarize themselves with the new standards and revise local curriculum to meet these rigorous new demands.

The third focus is for our school counselors. During the 2012-2013 and 2013-2014 school years, they will be receiving training as well. Together, teachers and counselors will collaborate to ensure students are becoming college, career, and life ready. While teachers become experts in content standards and determine how best to teach them, counselors will become experts in "South Dakota's workforce priorities, labor market needs, postsecondary options, and available resources" to help students prepare for what lies beyond their K-12 experience. To repeat a well-used cliché... this is where the rubber meets the road.

As I'm sure you see, there is a great deal of work to be done and we have excellent staff members to take on the challenge. I am confident our teachers will be well prepared for our students to return next school year. I'm equally confident this work will enable our students to be successful after they leave the Dell Rapids School District to pursue their goals and dreams.

The 66th Annual South Dakota American Legion Auxiliary Girls State citizenship program is right around the corner. This program will be held at the University of South Dakota in Vermillion South Dakota through the dates of May 28th and June 2, 2012.

Back in the depression ridden days of the early 30s, the American legion grew concerned over public statements to the effect that democracy was "on the kids." How, it wondered, could America train it's young people in the processes of self government. Deciding the best way to learn was by practicing it, American Legionnaires began, in 1935, gathering teenage representatives together for a few days each summer in a citizenship training program on the processes of city, county and state government; now called "Boys State."

As the program succeeded and spread throughout the United States, the American Legion Auxiliary began a similar program for girls. Thus "Girls State" was authorized in 1937 to 1938s. Together the best girls from all over the state of South Dakota to experience a week of intensive training in citizenship and government.

Girls State is a laboratory of political science. Each participant takes an active part in the week's activities and

learns that her government is just what she makes it. As future voters and office holders, Girls Staters gain a thorough understanding of the workings of the government.

'Who is eligible to attend Girls State?' Well, there are certain standards all participants need to meet before they are accepted. All girls must be finishing her junior year of high school with one semester remaining. Each individual must have a high moral character with strong leadership abilities and above average scholastic standing. They must demonstrate definite interest in American government. Participants must submit a statement of interest available from the Auxiliary unit. They are required to attend a full session of Girls State. Meeting all of the above requirements from our small town of Dell Rapids, South Dakota is Miranda Broin, Chelsey Huffman, Corynn Hoff and McKenzie Rinehart.

"I wanted to apply because I had heard about it from my sister and other upperclassmen. They all said it was a great learning experience," said Broin.

"I wanted to apply for it because I heard from people who went there in the past, including my mom, that it was very beneficial and especially fun," said Hoff.

All the girls are very excited to take on this opportunity to both meet new friends and learn about the government surrounding them.

Ag in Action

Common fish of South Dakota have been the main focus of the Wildlife and Fisheries classes. The students have been exposed to the identifiable characteristics of the various species. Fishing techniques and baits will be the next unit.

John Pollmann will be coming in to demonstrate waterfowl hunting techniques on April 5.

The Introduction to Agriculture, Food and Natural Resources students have been covering a unit on crops and horticulture. The various crops grown in the US, along with plant parts and propagation are the main focus. The students will have the opportunity to plant some seeds under grow light to examine the germination process. Natural resources including soil and water will be the next unit which exposes students to the importance of soil conservation and water quality.

Carburetion, ignition, lubrication and cooling are the last topics to be covered before the Ag Power Technology students will have the opportunity to work on their own engine projects in the shop. Those projects can include just general maintenance to a complete disassembly, repair and reassembly.

The FFA members continue to prepare for the various Career Development Events at the State FFA Convention on April 15-17 held on the campus of SDSU in Brookings. The Dell Rapids FFA Chapter had 7 members attend the event held in DeSmet on March 6. Joe

Wolles placed 3rd in the Ag Mechanics event in which they took a written test, used a transit to determine change in elevation, use a welder to join two pieces of metal together, and identify various tools. Peter Nebben was the other participant from our chapter to compete in the Ag Mechanics event placing 31st.

In the Floriculture event, we had two participants that had to complete a floral arrangement, identify various plants and tools, complete a problem solving activity and take a written test. The two participants representing Dell Rapids were Riley Miller, who placed 29th and Jackson Entringer, who placed 58th. Heidi Anderson competed in the Horse Evaluation event and placed 55th. This event consists of looking at four horses and ranking them from best to worst based on physical appearance and structural correctness. The participants also had to take a written test related to the horse industry.

In the Milk Quality and Products event, we had Trevor Hanzlik and Adam Reams participate by taking a written test relating to dairy manufacturing, evaluate 10 milk samples for quality of the flavor and identify 10 cheese samples. Trevor placed 40th and Adam placed 60th. On March 12th, we had twelve members participate in the various career development events hosted by the Tri-Valley FFA chapter. Joe Wolles once again participated in the Ag Mechanics event and placed 12th as an individual along with Colin LeBrun placing 46th, John Merry placing 92nd and Cody Nielsen placing 95th. The team total placed Dell Rapids in second when the scores of Joe, Co-

lin and John were added together. Gina Wolles was the only participant from Dell Rapids in the Dairy Cattle Evaluation and placed 7th. This event consists of ranking dairy animals from best to worst, explaining your ranking by giving oral reasons, taking a written test, evaluating animals based on their pedigree and selecting the best bull to use on cows based on production records.

In the Milk Quality and Products event Jackson Entringer placed 26th, Riley Miller placed 43rd and Colin Karst placed 85th with the team placing 11th.

The Livestock Evaluation event requires participants to evaluate beef, sheep and swine by ranking them from best to worst. The members were also required to justify their decisions by answering questions and giving oral reasons. Five beef animals were graded for both quality and yield based on physical indicators. Andrew Wiebenga placed 74th, Trevor Hanzlik placed 113th, Adam Reams placed 118th and David Halvorson placed 123rd. The FFA members attended the Career Development Events hosted by Flandreau on March 19th, the events hosted by Lennox on March 29th and the events held during the Little International at Brookings on March 30.

Those members who have done the best at the various competitions will be selected to be on the teams to represent Dell Rapids at the State FFA Convention. The chapter will also be holding the annual parent/member banquet on Sunday, April 22nd in the middle school commons to recognize the members on their accomplishments from the past year.

Junior Achievement Demonstration

Every year the sophomores here at Dell Rapids have a Junior Achievement week for Mr. Steve Hansen's economics class.

Economics is a class offered at DRHS to teach the students about the national ideas and how the free enterprise system influences our levels of living.

Kari Karst, one of the JA instructors, came to Dell Rapids to teach the current sophomores more on economics and personal finance. The

topics included budgeting, credit, identity theft and how to prevent it, insurance pros and cons, and investments.

"I think it is beneficial for our kids to hear from people in the community about the importance of personal finance and ways to help protect them with life lessons," said Hansen.

Throughout the week, Karst taught one subject a day. By playing interactive and thinking games, the students learned more about decisions and what the better option would be in given situations. This program is here to help students make better decisions and plan for their future finances and goals.

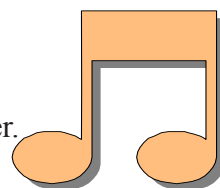

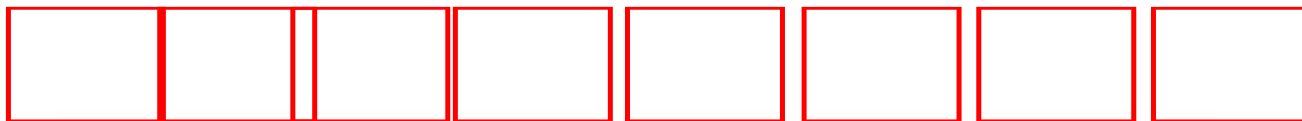

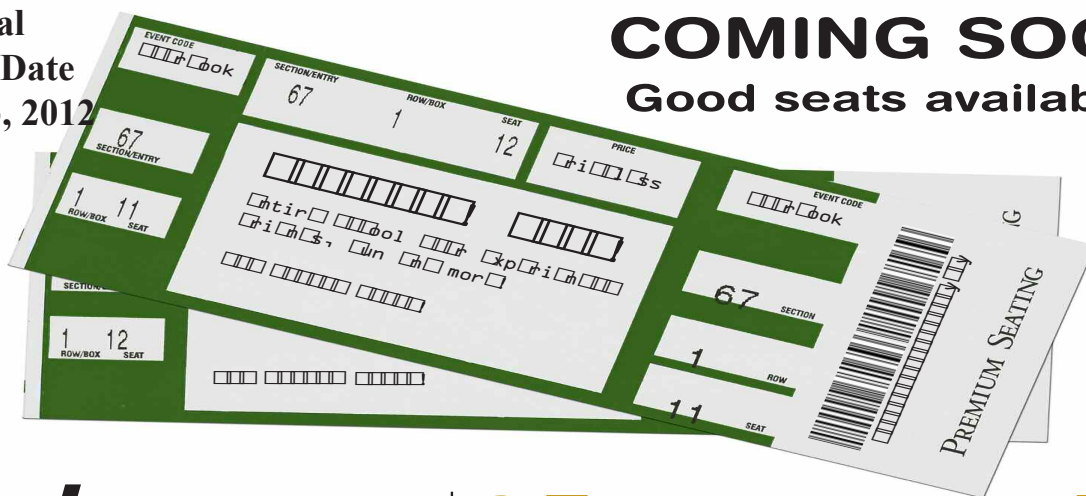
