Imagine Learning is a technology based, language and literacy program that features interactive content, including activities, videos, songs and games. This grant will allow 136 of our students to use the program on a daily basis.

While we understand that nothing will replace solid teacher to student intervention, it is our belief that utilizing technology for learning is a positive, engaging, supplemental alternative. The use of technology allows us to reach a higher number of students in an efficient amount of time. This program will automatically assess and interpret skill deficits in the area of reading through a series of assessments. Students will be placed into the program and provided individualized instruction through the computer, iPad or Chromebook. Effectiveness of this program has been researched to be beneficial to early learners. We plan to deploy this program to students in our

Early Childhood and Kindergarten Prep programs. Additionally, many other students will be a part of this program that we hope will be one component to supplement other programs and services we provide to struggling readers.

The Dell Rapids School District will host a Kindergarten Screening on February 27th and 28th at the elementary school. Dell Rapids is able to offer "all day, every day" kindergarten, as well as a Kindergarten Prep program that follows the same schedule. South Dakota law stipulates Kindergarten eligibility for those children turning 5 on or before September 1st of the current year. While the chronological age gives us a cutoff date for eligibility, it is a variety of other information the school and parents should gather through assessments, observation and conversation with caregivers. Below is a list of developmental areas our screening team will be assessing:

- Social Development
- Emotional Development
- Language Development
- Motor Development
- Intellectual and Academic Development





Ag In Action

Because of the high number of students wanting to take Introduction to Agriculture, Food and Natural Resources, another section is being offered the second semester. The 23 second period

students will have the opportunity to learn about the role of the FFA organization in Agriculture Education, define and discuss the concepts of natural resources, demonstrate an understanding of animal science systems, demonstrate an understanding of plant structure and function, relate basic food science technology principles to production agriculture, summarize basic food science technology, and summarize basic principles involved in agricultural systems technology. They will also have the opportunity to learn about shop tools and shop safety, project design and construct a small wood project.

Another section of Wildlife and Fisheries class is being offered during the spring semester to 17 students during 1st half of 3rd block and it will last the entire semester. Students enrolled in this class will recognize the importance of managing fish and wildlife and understand the importance habitat plays in their populations, identify key factors including economic and social issues related to fish and wildlife and identify life patterns of fish and wildlife.

During the 2nd half of 3rd block, 20 students are enrolled in the Fundamental Animal Science course. In this class the students will apply knowledge of anatomy and physiology to produce and/or manage animals in a domesticated or natural environment; recognize animal behavior to facilitate working with animals safely; provide proper nutrition to maintain animal performance; know the factors that influence an animal's reproductive cycle; identify environmental factors that affect an animal's performance.

The quarter long class of Fundamental Ag Mechanics is being held during 4th block. The 16 students enrolled in this class will have the opportunity to apply safety skills with engineering applications with mechanical equipment, structures, land treatment, power utilization and technology; exercise basic skills in blueprint and design development to create sketches, drawing and plans with estimate costs; develop skills required to use construction/fabrication equipment and tools; use a variety of concrete and masonry products; apply math and science principles to identify

soil and water engineering and their properties.

During the 4th quarter, the class offered 4th block will be Ag Power Technology. This class will consist of 9 students analyzing various engine information in the classroom before going to the shop to work on engines. The classroom instruction will include safety, tools, fasteners, principles of operation, 2 and 4 cycle engines, engine performance, emission controls, carburetion, ignition systems, lubrication systems, cooling systems and preventative maintenance and troubleshooting. The students will then have the opportunity to work on their own engine projects ranging from general maintenance to complete overhauls.

FFA members Lindsey Wolles and Lexi Klein exhibited beef heifers at the Sioux Falls Farm Show Invitational Youth Calf Show on Jan. 25. Lindsey won her class and Lexi placed second in her class. Both girls participated in the showmanship event with Lindsey making it into the top five finalists. The FFA reward trip for members based on past participation had Evan Brown, Justin Huss, Trevor Pulscher, Cheyenne Adams, Riley Anderson and Jesse Michel qualifying to attend. These members decided to attend the Black Hills Stock Show and Rodeo on Jan. 27 and 28. They walked through the trade show and viewed items on display ranging from animal health products and equipment to clothing and western art. They also attended the PRCA rodeo and enjoyed the indoor water park in Rapid City. In the FFA several scholarships are available for senior members such as five scholarships of \$500 each for members who plan to major in agriculture at a South Dakota University or Technical Institute. A \$500 scholarship is available for a member planning to enroll at South Dakota State University majoring in Agriculture Education with these applications due Feb. 15. Younger members can apply for the four \$500 scholarships to attend the Washington Leadership Conference held during the summer with the application deadline also Feb. 15. The National FFA Week will be celebrated from Feb. 18-25. FFA Week is an opportunity for FFA members, alumni and sponsors to advocate for agricultural education and FFA. It's a time to share what FFA is and the impact it has on members every day. In March the Career Development Events take place in preparation for the State FFA Convention. There are 15 different areas that members can develop their skills in that can eventually lead to career success. The areas include: Ag Business Management; Ag Mechanics; Agronomy; Biotechnology, Dairy Cattle Evaluation; Floriculture;

The summer also has opportunities for members to develop their leadership skills by attending one of the State FFA Leadership Retreats. One retreat will be held June 27-30 at Swan Lake near Viborg and the other will be held July 11-14 at Camp Bob Marshall near Custer. By attending one of these retreats, FFA

members will develop and enhance their leadership skills and self-confidence through interactive learning. There will be workshops that help members discover the value of servant leadership, character, attitude, a focused vision, communication, trust, and responsibility. Another leadership opportunity would be to attend the Washington Leadership Conference. During the five-day event, attendees learn how to become effective leaders by learning their purpose, how to value people, how to take action, and how to serve others. FFA members leave WLC with the knowledge and the confidence to act in ways that help their schools, community, and their country. This conference is held seven different weeks throughout the summer to allow members flexibility to attend this action-packed week that will help them gain self-confidence and leadership skills to bring back to the FFA chapter and share with other members. Registration opens March 1 for the sessions which are: June 6-10; June 13-17; June 20-24; June 27-July 1; July 11-15; July 18-22; and July 25-29.
